I believe the strengths of Coxheath Primary School to be:

- The quality of teaching. Teachers have visibly improved and there are much higher standards. They have a positive and caring attitude towards the children.
- Strong leadership. The school is well led and there has been a clear positive change.
- The school seems to be generally better since merging with Loose. This has been noticed in leadership, teaching and the school environment.
- Having Twitter and receiving weekly newsletters.
- Caring members of staff and the school has a 'community feel'.
- Communication to parents has improved.
- There is a good relationship between parents and staff.
- The presence of staff at the beginning and end of the school day.
- Ensuring the wellbeing of children.

I believe that Coxheath Primary School needs to improve in the following areas:

- The introduction of more school clubs at lunchtime and especially after school.
- A holiday club/after school care for working parents.
- Opening the breakfast club at 7.30am and for all parents to have more information about breakfast club (what they offer)
- Dealing with behaviour and bullying. Especially behaviour at lunchtime for some children.
- The SEN area seems to be under resourced. Regarding appointments, information for parents on children's progress and making sure all SEN children are accessing the extra help they need.
- Hygiene and the cleanliness of the school.
- Having more music lessons.
- Guidance on homework for parents.
- Consistency in staff.

Any other comments:

- Great site improvements including the new build.
- The school could introduce the 'Daily Mile' programme.
- Having a Christmas play again for all children.
- The possibility of opening the library gate.
