## Head Teacher News

This week, pupils took part in a wholeschool assembly on Monday focused on the importance of reading for pleasure. We discussed why reading matters, how it supports both learning and wellbeing, and how finding the right book can make a real difference.

The assembly linked closely to recent national research into children's reading habits, and we wanted to share some of these findings with you.

### Children's Reading in 2025

The latest research, based on responses from almost 115,000 children and young people across the UK, shows that reading for enjoyment is at its lowest level in 20 years:

- Only 1 in 3 children aged 8–18 say they enjoy reading in their free time
- Just 1 in 5 read something daily for pleasure

While these findings are concerning, the research also offers hopeful insights into what helps motivate children to read.

What motivates children to read?

Children are more likely to engage with reading when:

- They are able to choose what they read
- Books link to films, TV programmes or interests they already enjoy
- Texts are visually engaging, such as comics or graphic novels
- They hear recommendations from friends, family or teachers
- Reading is available in different formats, including digital

Encouragingly, even children who say they do not enjoy reading still recognise its value. Nearly half say that reading helps them learn new words and discover new things.

How you can support reading at home

You can help reinforce the messages from Monday's assembly by:

- Encouraging your child to read anything that interests them
- Talking together about books, magazines or online texts they enjoy
- Visiting libraries or bookshops as a family
- Modelling reading for pleasure at home

Please remember that all reading counts, whether it's a novel, a comic, a magazine, song lyrics or an online article.

Over the coming term, we will be working closely with both children and staff to further encourage a love of reading across the school, helping to make reading enjoyable, relevant and accessible for everyone.

By working together, we can help children develop a lifelong love of reading.

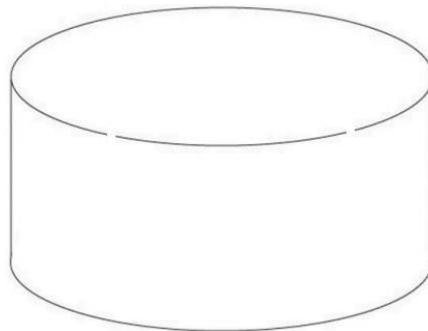

## Young Artists Competition - Royal Academy Young Artists Competition 2026

**You should have received an email this week with instructions on how to enter your child to the Royal Academy Young Artists Competition. Information is also below for your reference. please note, if your child wishes to enter, please do not send artwork into the school, it needs to be entered by parents / carers from home with the permissions form.**

'Taking inspiration from the Summer Exhibition, the Young Artists' Summer Show is a free, open submission exhibition for young artists aged 4–18 years studying in the UK.

Submitting artwork is completely free and is done online. You will need to create an account in order so submit the artwork but this is quick and easy to do.

Each student can submit one artwork and there is no theme. The artwork can be made using any material; it can be a painting, sculpture, photograph, installation, video, drawing, or a combination.

When you enter, they'll ask for an image of the artwork plus some information about the piece such as title, size, and some text written by the artist which can include why they created the work and what it means to them.

Artworks are viewed and judged by a panel of experienced and passionate artists and arts professionals and they work together to select which artworks will be shown online and which will be shown at the Royal Academy.

# Guidance for submissions

The Young Artists' Summer Show is an opportunity for UK-based young artists aged 4-18 to make and share a piece of artwork that truly expresses their own voice. There is no set theme and we welcome submissions covering a range of techniques including drawing, painting, printing, photography, sculpture, textile, fashion, animation, video, and more.

## What we're looking for:

- Judges are looking for imagination, originality and skill.
- Each artist can submit one artwork along with a short artist statement or description, written in the artist's own words where possible. Rather than solely focussing on the artmaking process, we encourage artists to describe why an artwork was created and what it means to them. Descriptions must be no more than 80 words and, if the work is selected, it will be subject to editing by the RA ahead of display.
- Capturing a good image of the artwork is very important and could influence the way that the artwork is viewed by the judges. You can read more about photographing your artwork in our [FAQs](#).
- If you are a teacher who intends to submit artwork for each student in your class, we advise against submitting visually similar works.
- We recommend submitting well ahead of the deadline to avoid last-minute or technical difficulties.

## We can't accept submissions that:

- Exceed 950mm wide x 3000mm high.
- Pose a health and safety risk.
- Are submitted late.
- Might infringe others' rights or break the law in any way, including copyright. Although many great artists 'copy' in creative ways, we are looking for original artwork.

So please avoid submitting artworks solely depicting characters from popular culture, including TV, animation or comic books, for example.

- Are AI-generated.
- Contain content in the artwork or artist statement that may be sensitive or otherwise unsuitable to display publicly in an exhibition for artists aged 4-18.

The RA is committed to freedom of expression and, at the same time, has a duty to safeguard the young people involved in and visiting the show. All submissions must therefore be considered within this context. This is not always possible to predict in advance and for that reason submissions will be subject to review, through the selection process described in the Terms and Conditions of Entry.

Supporting young artists to create and submit original artworks is an achievement and something worth celebrating. We encourage this to be the focus over being accepted into the show. We enjoy seeing each and every artwork submitted and can't wait to see what our young artists will make this year!

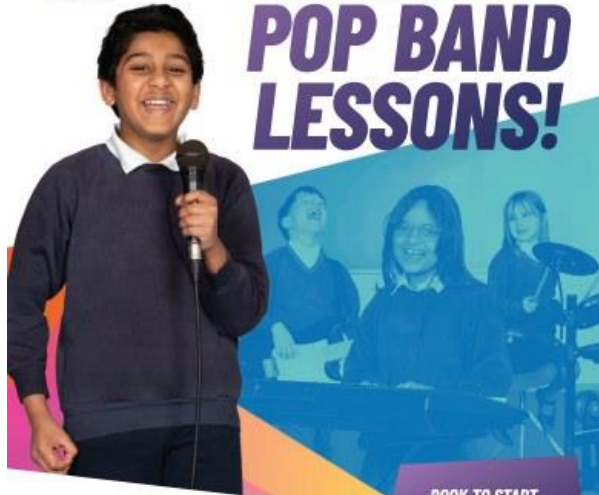
