## Head Teacher News

Well, we have officially reached the midpoint of the academic year. I am sure everyone is looking forward to a well-earned week off from what has felt like one of the wettest terms we have experienced in a very long time.

It will come as no surprise that, as of mid February 2026, Kent, along with much of the United Kingdom, has experienced an exceptionally wet start to the year, with rain falling almost daily for over 40 days. Despite the relentless weather, it certainly hasn't dampened the spirit of learning in school.

We are delighted to have introduced IXL, a new online maths platform designed to support the delivery of a more personalised curriculum. All pupils from Year 2 upwards have access to this platform from home, providing a fantastic opportunity to further develop and consolidate their mathematical skills beyond the classroom.

Our new podcast team, The Pod Squad, has also released their first podcast of the term. Look out for their termly episodes via the link in this newsletter and on our website. They will be interviewing special guests, debating topical issues and giving listeners a real insight into what life in Coxheath is all about. A huge thank you to the PTA for kindly agreeing to purchase the equipment that enables The Pod Squad to run such a professional show. Your continued support makes opportunities like this possible for our children.

It is also wonderful news that we have ended this term with attendance slightly above the national average. This is a fantastic achievement and reflects the commitment of our families and pupils. It is vital that we continue this positive drive next term, as we know the significant impact that good attendance has on both wellbeing and academic achievement.

Finally, a gentle reminder regarding school uniform: unless there is a medical need that has been agreed with the school, children should not be wearing trainers. The school uniform requires black school shoes, and it is important that all pupils attend in the correct uniform each day. Thank you for your continued support in maintaining our high standards.

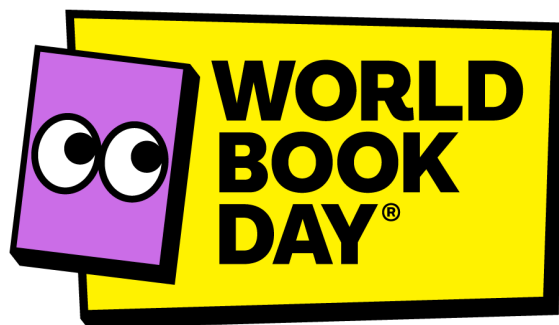

## Guidance for submissions

The Young Artists' Summer Show is an opportunity for UK-based young artists aged 4-18 to make and share a piece of artwork that truly expresses their own voice. There is no set theme and we welcome submissions covering a range of techniques including drawing, painting, printing, photography, sculpture, textile, fashion, animation, video, and more.

### What we're looking for:

- Judges are looking for imagination, originality and skill.
- Each artist can submit one artwork along with a short artist statement or description, written in the artist's own words where possible. Rather than solely focussing on the artmaking process, we encourage artists to describe why an artwork was created and what it means to them. Descriptions must be no more than 80 words and, if the work is selected, it will be subject to editing by the RA ahead of display.
- Capturing a good image of the artwork is very important and could influence the way that the artwork is viewed by the judges. You can read more about photographing your artwork in our FAQs.
- If you are a teacher who intends to submit artwork for each student in your class, we advise against submitting visually similar works.
- We recommend submitting well ahead of the deadline to avoid last-minute or technical difficulties.

### We can't accept submissions that:

- Exceed 950mm wide x 3000mm high.
- Pose a health and safety risk.
- Are submitted late.
- Might infringe others' rights or break the law in any way, including copyright. Although many great artists 'copy' in creative ways, we are looking for original artwork.

- Are AI-generated.
- Contain content in the artwork or artist statement that may be sensitive or otherwise unsuitable to display publicly in an exhibition for artists aged 4-18.

The RA is committed to freedom of expression and, at the same time, has a duty to safeguard the young people involved in and visiting the show. All submissions must therefore be considered within this context. This is not always possible to predict in advance and for that reason submissions will be subject to review, through the selection process described in the Terms and Conditions of Entry.

Supporting young artists to create and submit original artworks is an achievement and something worth celebrating. We encourage this to be the focus over being accepted into the show. We enjoy seeing each and every artwork submitted and can't wait to see what our young artists will make this year!

OSI (Online Support and Intervention) is an online platform designed to help parents to learn tools and techniques to help their child (aged 5 to 12 years old) to overcome difficulties with anxiety.

Parents work through weekly online modules that contain videos, quizzes, and interactive worksheets. Parents are also supported by a weekly telephone/video call appointment with a practitioner.
