Our recent parent survey results have been collated and will be shared at the start of next term. Hockey Tournament at Maidstone Hockey Club

On Friday 27th March, we took 20 children from across Key Stage 2 to compete in a hockey festival and a series of games at Maidstone Hockey Club. The event brought together a number of local schools and provided a fantastic opportunity for pupils to develop their skills, build confidence and experience competitive sport in a fun and supportive environment.

The morning session saw our Year 3 and 4 children take part in a range of passing, shooting and dribbling drills, led by experienced coaches. These activities helped the children to practise key skills before putting them into action during fixtures against six other schools. Coxheath performed brilliantly throughout, showing excellent teamwork, determination and sportsmanship. They finished in 1st place without losing a match or conceding a single goal—an outstanding achievement. It was a fantastic morning filled with smiles, enthusiasm and great competition, and the children represented the school superbly.

In the afternoon, our Year 5 and 6 children arrived and took part in a similar format. They began with a carousel of skill-based activities, focusing on control, accuracy and game awareness, before moving on to competitive fixtures. Once again, our students were a credit to the school, demonstrating resilience, encouragement towards teammates and a positive attitude throughout the afternoon. For many, this was their first experience of playing competitive hockey, and they rose to the challenge impressively.

They made a strong start by winning their first three matches, before narrowly losing one and drawing another closely contested game. Showing great determination, they went on to win their remaining matches, finishing in a very respectable 3rd place out of 8 teams—just missing out on second place on goal difference.

Across the whole day, it was wonderful to see pupils supporting one another, celebrating successes and learning from each game. The event not only showcased their sporting ability but also their excellent behaviour and teamwork.

School Car Park

Due to ongoing safety concerns and increasing issues with staff parking, we will be implementing stricter controls on the use of the school car park with immediate effect.

Going forward, parking on school grounds will only be permitted for vehicles displaying a valid Blue Badge and the person who the badge belongs to is present in the car.

Please note that we currently have only one designated disabled parking space available to accommodate this. The school car park must not be used by parents or carers for drop-offs, pick-ups (including for clubs or early collections), or any short-term parking.

We have recently experienced significant issues, including double and triple parking, which have prevented staff from accessing parking and arriving at class on time. More importantly, these conditions would make it extremely difficult for emergency vehicles to access the site if needed.

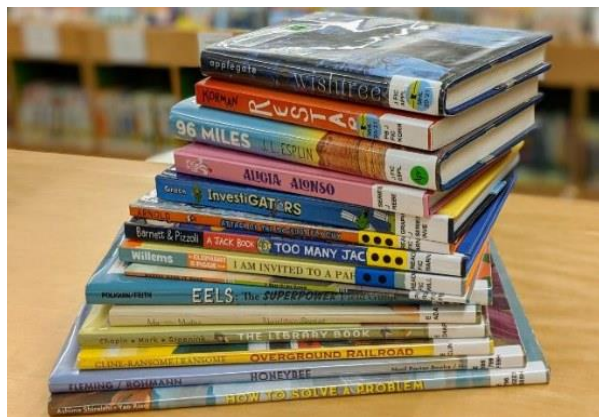
The safety of our children is always our highest priority, and the current parking situation presents an unacceptable risk. We therefore ask for your full cooperation in adhering to these new arrangements.

OSI COULD HELP YOU

OSI (Online Support and Intervention) is an online platform designed to help parents to learn tools and techniques to help their child (aged 5 to 12 years old) to overcome difficulties with anxiety.

Parents work through weekly online modules that contain videos, quizzes, and interactive worksheets. Parents are also supported by a weekly telephone/video call appointment with a practitioner.

You can access OSI at a convenient time for you using any electronic device!

Support for bereaved children and young people

Following the death of a family member or friend, young people need to have their loss acknowledged and their feelings recognised and to be given opportunities to hold onto the memories of the person who has died.

To support children and young people and to help them understand and manage their grief, we offer Workshops for those bereaved of a parent or sibling and Memory Days for those bereaved of another family member or friend.

Pre-bereavement support for children and young people

When a child is facing the death of someone close to them, their needs will be similar to those of adults, but they may find it difficult to express what they are feeling.

Through consultation, Slide Away provides advice and guidance to help the School Bereavement Contact support pupils who have a parent or sibling with a life-limiting illness.
