### **Headteacher News**

We had a fantastic time during World Book Day and it was wonderful to see all the amazing, creative costumes. World Book Day is a registered charity on a mission to give every child and young person a book of their own. It's also a celebration of authors, illustrators, books and (most importantly) it's a celebration of reading. In fact, it's the biggest celebration of its kind, designated by UNESCO as a worldwide celebration of books and reading, and is marked in over 100 countries all over the world.

Please continue to support our whole school priority on reading by ensuring children have opportunities to listen to stories and read regularly at home. An international study has found that children whose parents frequently read with them in primary school are still showing the benefit when they are 15. Please speak to your child's teacher if you would like support or recommendations of books that your child may enjoy.

We seem to have a number of children arriving late to school. This can make them anxious at the beginning of the day and impacts negatively on their learning. In order to ensure that the children have a settled start to the day we would ask all parents to make sure that their children arrive before 8:50am ready to start the school

I would ask all parents to remain extremely vigilant regarding children's use of online resources. We often have reports of children being targeted online through social media sites and online gaming. It is of the utmost importance that you check all security settings and reinforce with your children how to stay safe online. 
#### Good attendance means...

#### Vacancy for a Co-opted Local Governor for Coppice Primary Partnership Trust

The Trust currently has a vacancy for a Co-opted Governor at Loose Primary School with specific business / finance knowledge to be appointed to the Local Governing Body (LGB).

The person we are seeking would ideally have a professional background in finance or experience of managing a substantial budget and would be willing to support the work of the schools. Previous experience of governorship would be valued but not necessarily required, the most important thing is to have a keen interest in the schools and be prepared to play an active part in the LGB's work. In order to support Governors in their role, training can be provided at no cost to the individual. LGB's meet 6 times a year and the commitment would include three monitoring visits to meet with school leaders.
