
Thank you for attending the parent consultation sessions this week. Our partnership with you truly develops a child's learning in a positive way. Should you wish to have further discussions, please do not hesitate to contact us.

Today teachers and support staff were fortunate to receive training on autism from the Kent Educational Psychology Service. The training centred around gaining a deeper understanding of autism and the strengths and differences pupils with autism may experience. It also offered practical support and strategies that can be used to ensure that we continue to develop an ethos and environment that fosters social inclusion for all pupils. Teachers have also been busy updating the curriculum pages on our website with the spellings and areas of new learning for next term Coxheath Primary School - Year Groups The website can be a good starting point to talk to your child about their learning. I am sure that many of you will get the same response that I receive from both my girls when I ask them what they what they have been learning - 'not much!'

The first week back after half term, we will be holding parent tours for our prospective new parents that will join in September 2024. The school continues to grow both in size and popularity and is oversubscribed. In the past, this has resulted in children who live close to the school not being able to secure a place. As part of the KCC commissioning plan, they forecast birth rates and demand on school places. It is predicted that there will not be enough places for Coxheath children in the coming years and therefore a consultation on expansion will be commencing on the 13th November, with Coxheath Primary school offering an additional 30 places via a bulge year in September 2024. More information will be shared via the consultation process.

I hope you all find some time to relax and enjoy some quality family time and we look forward to welcoming everyone back on Monday 30th October.
