

Southern Water Financial Hardship Fund

To provide additional assistance to individuals who are experiencing financial difficulty. Through this fund, they offer three types of assistance:

- A one-off bill reduction (of up to 50%)
- A debt write-off (of up to £2,000)
- A grant towards specific home appliances & furniture (of up to £1,000)

To qualify, you must be able to demonstrate significant financial hardship, either long or short term, or challenging personal circumstances that have a financial impact. There is a <u>short online form</u> to complete and they will let you know the outcome within six weeks.
